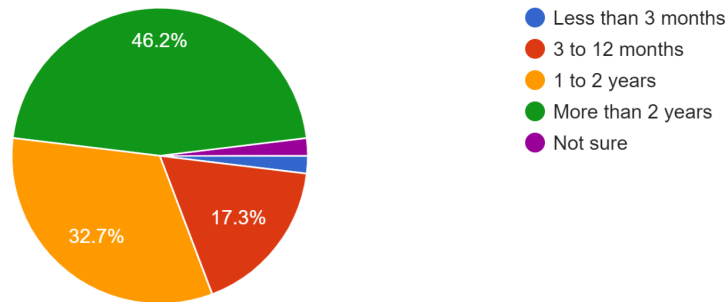

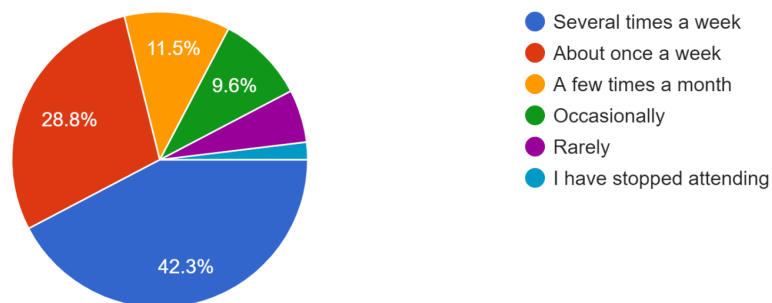
How long have you been a member?

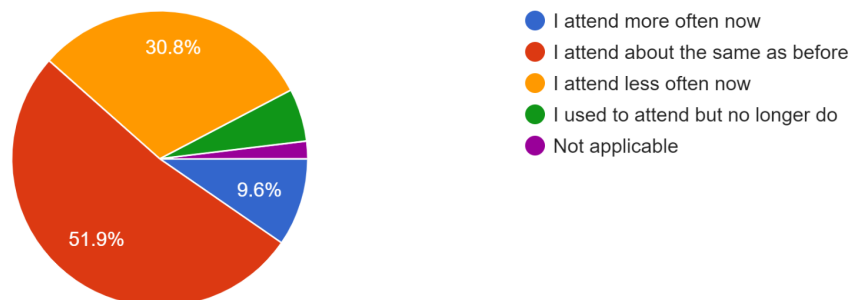
How often do you currently attend?

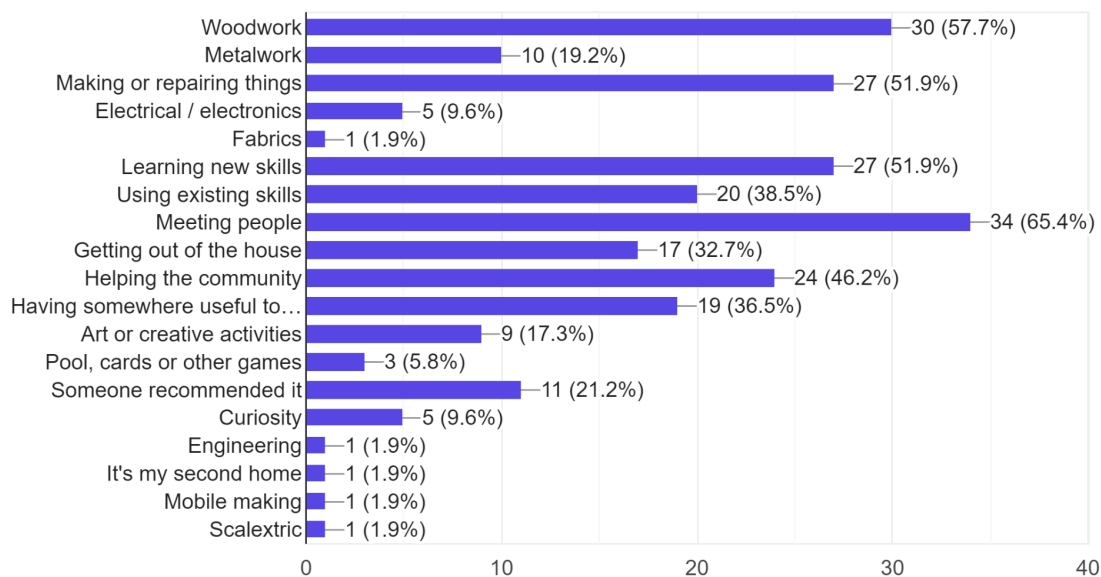
Has your attendance changed over time?

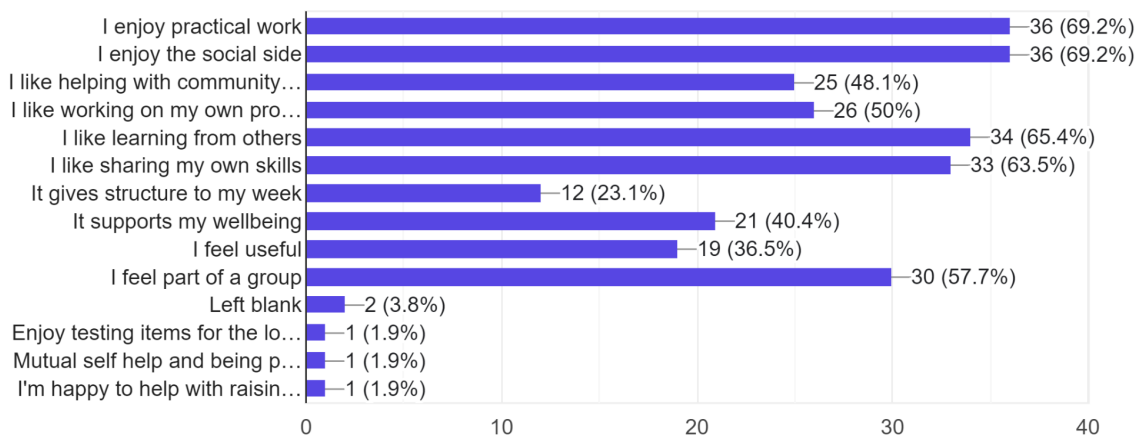
What first attracted you to the Shed? Please tick all that apply.

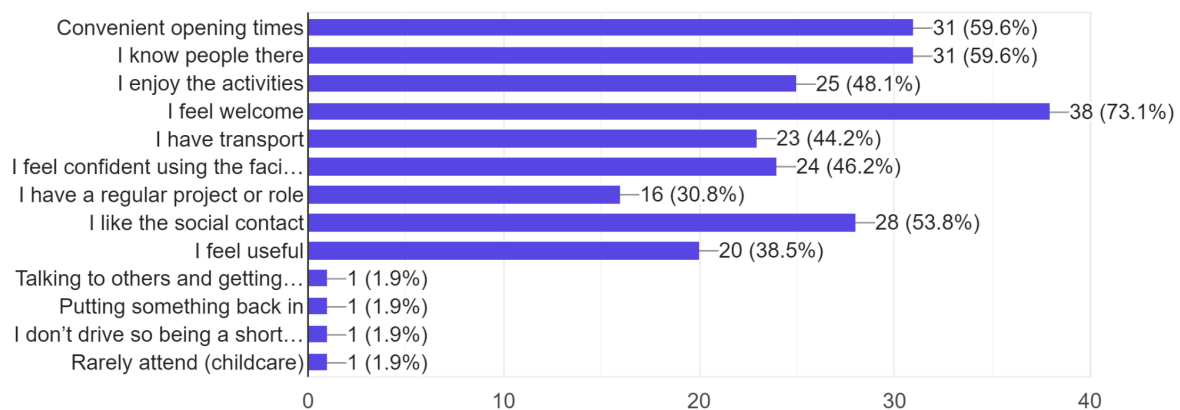
What are your main reasons for being a member now? Please tick all that apply.

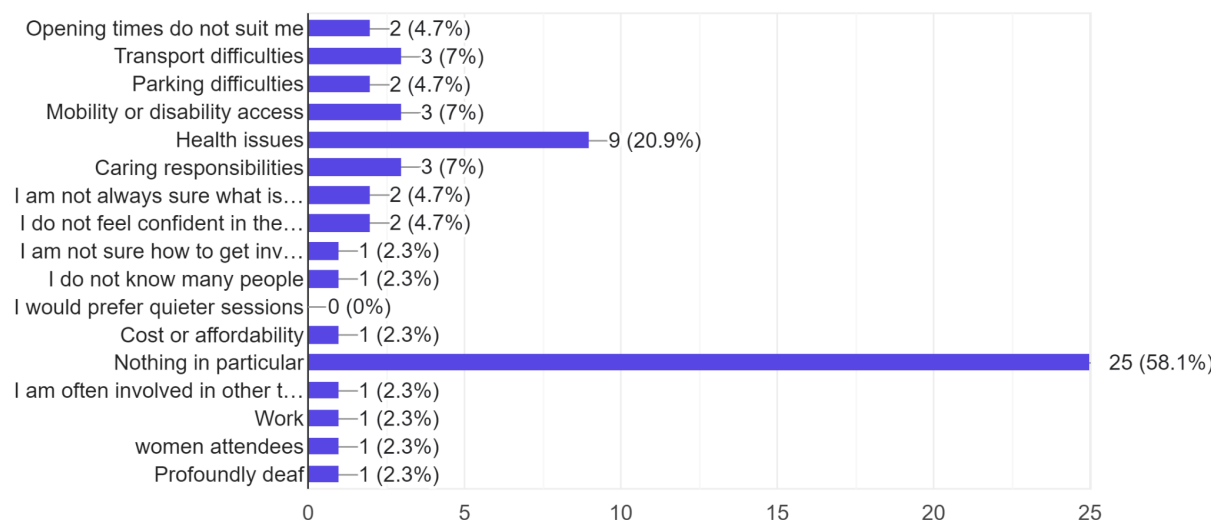
What helps you attend the Shed? Please tick all that apply.

What makes it difficult for you to attend? Please tick all that apply.

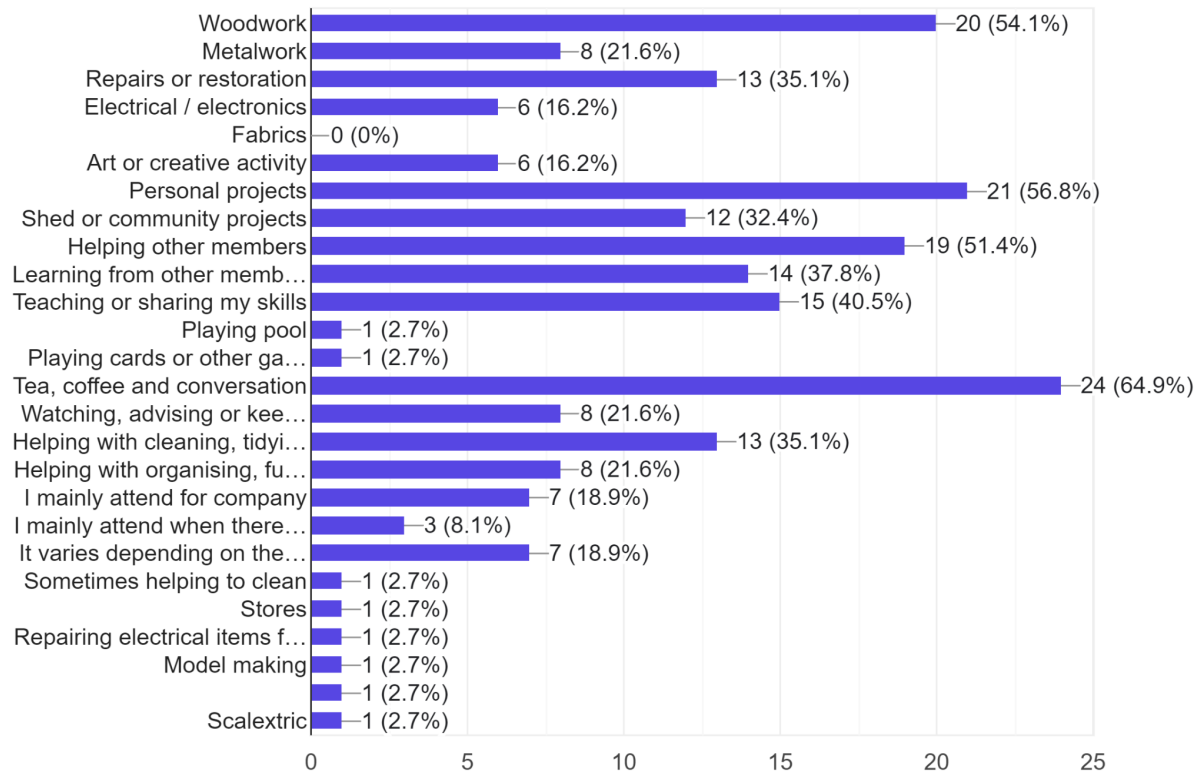

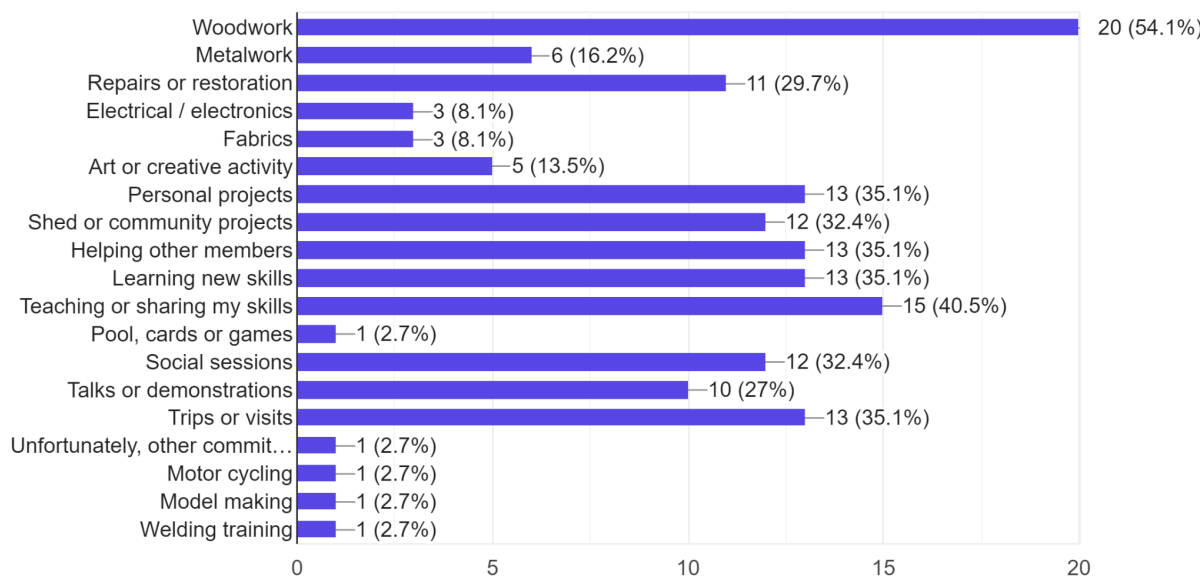
When you attend the Shed, what do you usually spend your time doing? Please tick all that apply.

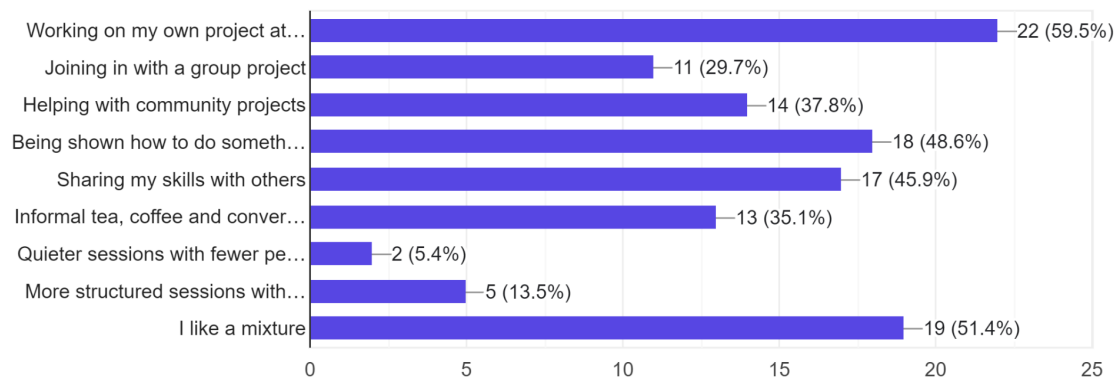
Which of these would you like to do more of? Please tick all that apply.

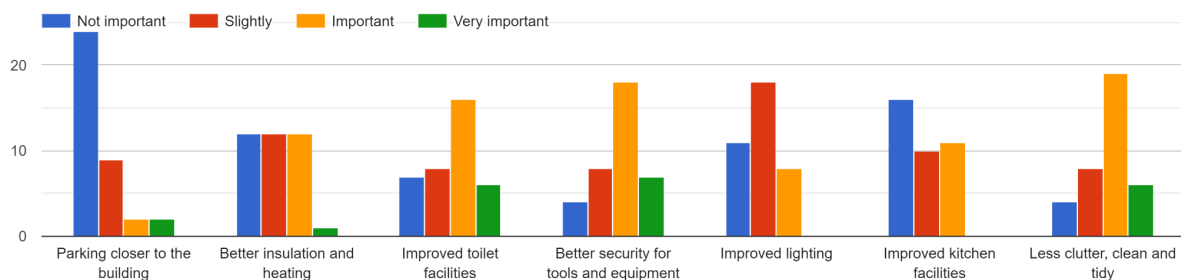

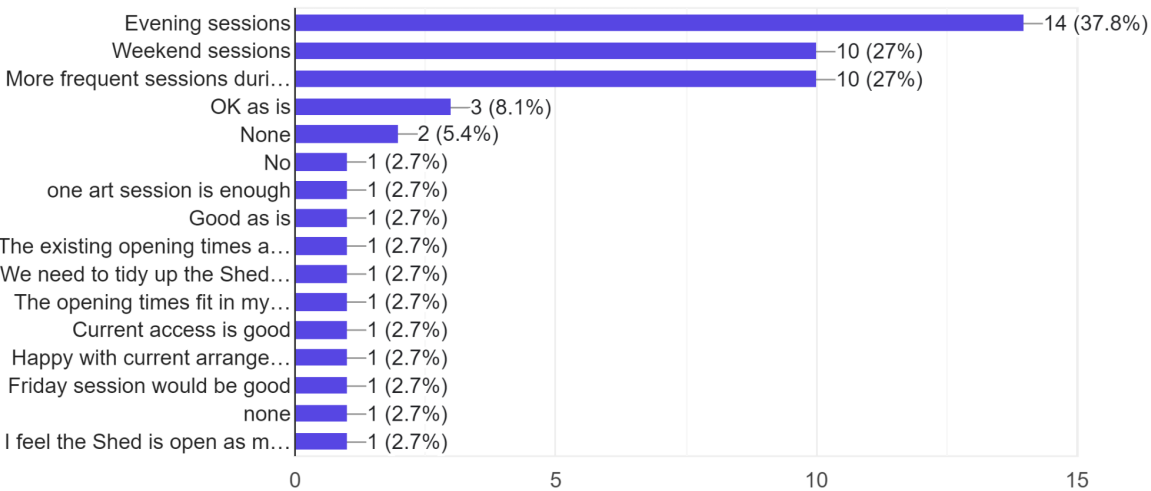

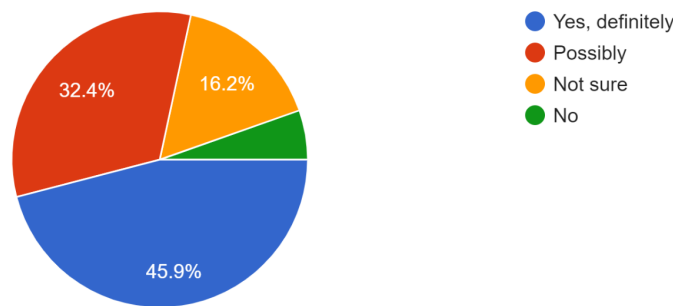

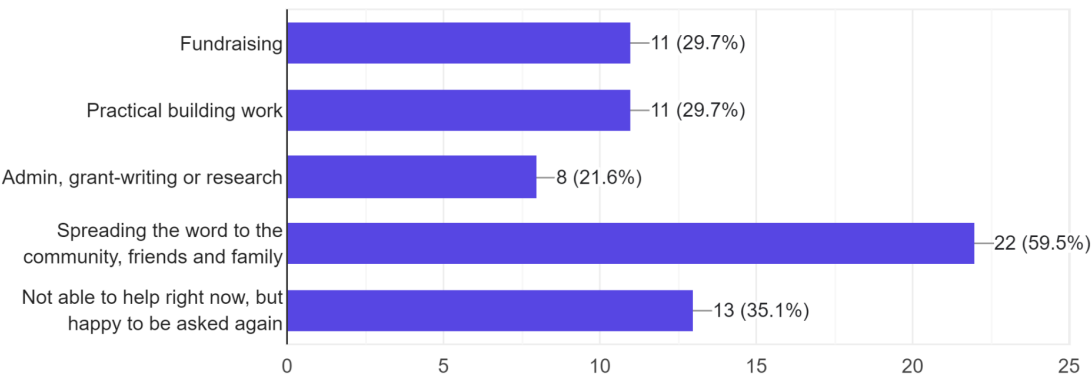

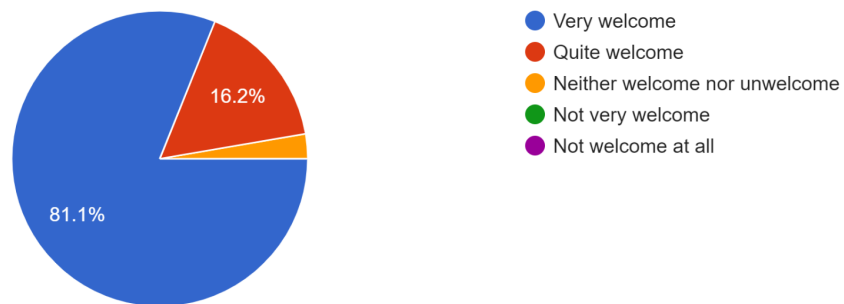

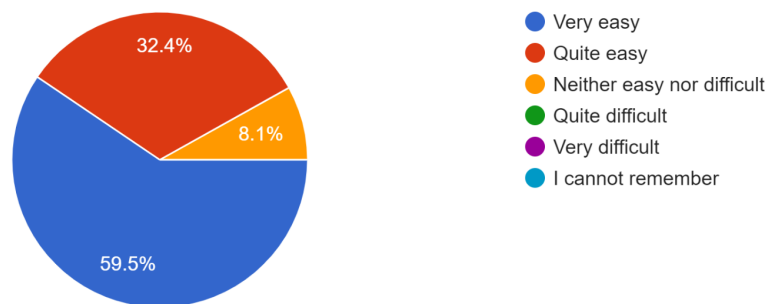

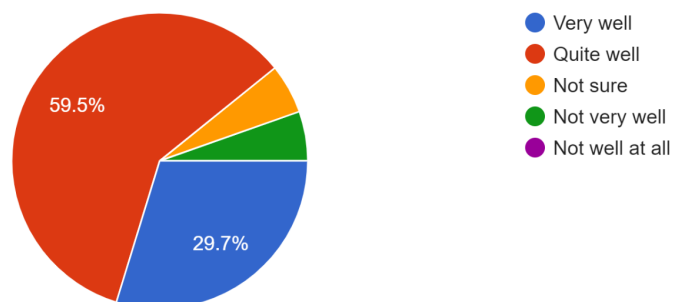
How easy was it to get started as a new member?

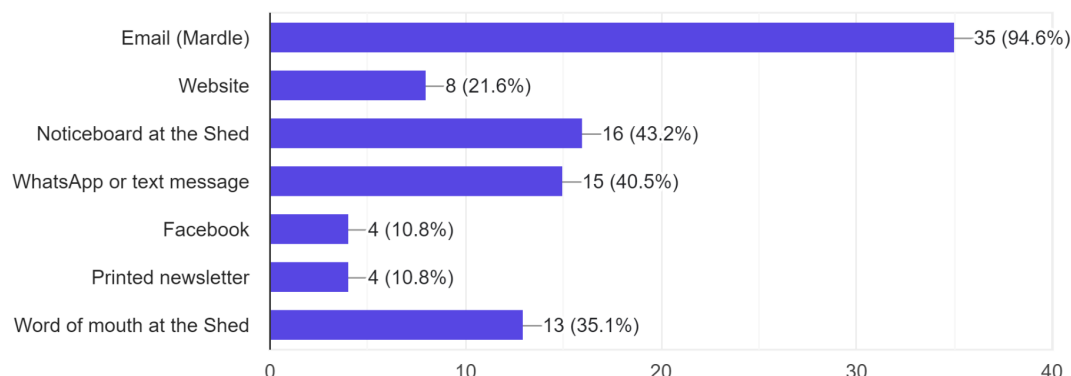
How well do we communicate what is happening at the Shed?
